

The Grand National course is triangular with its apex (at the Canal Turn) the furthest point from the stands. It covers two and a quarter miles and is perfectly flat throughout. Inside is the easier Mildmay course, providing a circuit of one and a half miles, which has birch fences. Despite realignment of the last two bends in 1989, a major feature of the Mildmay course remains its sharpness.

The Grand National is run over two complete circuits taking in sixteen spruce fences first time round and fourteen the second, and, in spite of welcome modifications to the fences in recent years, the race still provides one of the toughest tests ever devised for horse and rider. The run from the final fence to the winning post is 494 yards long and includes an elbow.
