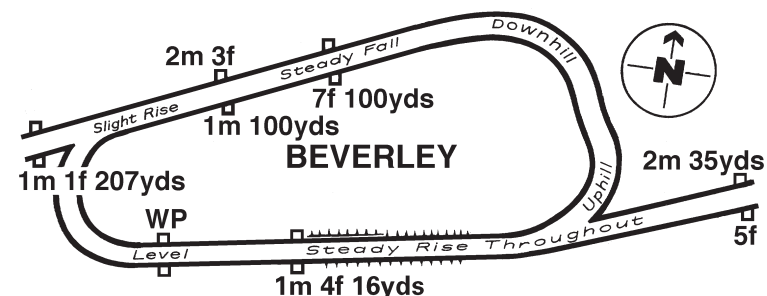

The horses are listed on the Timeform Race Card with their official race card numbers. The jockeys listed are those declared to ride at the time of going to press and are subject to amendment. The Beverley round course is a right-handed, oval track, just over a mile and three furlongs in extent, with a run-in of two and a half furlongs. The five-furlong track bends right at halfway. The general galloping nature of the track is modified by the downhill turn into the straight and the relatively short run-in. The five-furlong course is on the rise throughout, and so is rather testing even in normal conditions; in soft going it takes some getting, particularly for two-year-olds early in the season.



DRAW: When the stalls are placed on the far side, Beverley offers one of the strongest draw biases in the country courtesy of its five-furlong track, with high numbers dominating, particularly in handicaps. High numbers probably have the edge on the round course too, though it isn't so marked.
