

The horses are listed on the Timeform Race Card with their official race card numbers. The jockeys listed are those declared to ride at the time of going to press and are subject to amendment. The weights, owners' and trainers' names, and the colours to be worn by jockeys, have been added for convenience and are not guaranteed to be correct.

Punchestown is a right-handed, galloping, undulating track with a steady climb through the last five furlongs. On the two-mile chase circuit the ground rises after the winning post, before a turn and a downhill run. The back straight is level followed by the uphill run from the fourth last. The two-furlong shorter hurdles course has a similar configuration. Punchestown is a very fair test of a jumper. There are eleven fences to a circuit which are not stiff by British standards and they pose few problems to a sound jumper. The cross-country course at Punchestown is a long and twisting one over a variety of banks and other obstacles, few of which are jumped more than once. The turns are both left- and right-handed and only the final brush fence is on the racecourse proper. The start for both the three-mile Ladies Cup and the four-mile one-furlong La Touche Cup is situated behind the winning post.
